Operational assignments include Fort Davis, Panama; Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington DC; Camp Humphreys, Korea; Fort Lewis, Washington; Fort Sam Houston, Texas; Fort Benning, Georgia; Hunter Army Airfield, Georgia; and Bangkok, Thailand. He is a graduate of the US Army Rotary Wing Aviator Course qualified in both the UH-1 and UH-60 helicopters and is a trained maintenance test pilot. He commanded the 498th Medical Company (Air Ambulance) during humanitarian relief efforts for hurricane's Katrina and Rita.
